Stripping and grading of remainder of site is planned for this year. Concerns were expressed regarding the degree of maintenance that would be provided for the newly stripped and graded property given that some of it will remain undeveloped for 5 or more years.

# City

- requires passive and active spaces be allocated
- optional amenities will not be maintained by the City
- sustainable building and maintenance via Builders, Community Associations and Residents Associations, or park is adopted by a corporation etc must be made
- requires "Enhanced Landscape Maintenance Agreement"
- not a destination park so limited support from City
- City does have funds to connect paths (in some cases) Missing Links Program
- any buildings erected will require a LOC lease of occupation
- storage shed?
- washrooms (CA to maintain)? (see below)
- LOC requires:

- sustainable funding
- board liability insurance and building insurance
- incorporation done

# **Demographics:**

- demographics of Shawnee Slope (predominantly older) will change with younger families buying new homes in Shawnee Park
- think of these groups when designing public spaces
  - adults
  - teenagers
  - 6 to 12 years
  - 5 and under
- our community
  - no school
  - no community hub
  - no ice rink or buildings

## **Current Cardel Plan:**

- space is zoned as "Public MR"
- streets will have sidewalks on both sides
- see map provided
- Amenities:
  - open play space for all ages potentially, Ultimate (Frisbee),
     small sided games (soccer etc), disc golf, etc.
  - playground installation
  - fire pit
  - hard surface area
    - basket ball
    - includes a water service so hard surface area may be flooded in winter
- around pond naturalized space
- most of park will have mown grass manicured
- slopes
  - yet TBD depends upon road grade etc.
  - pathways may not be possible if the grade is steeper due to the cost if retaining walls are required
  - > 3:1 slope requires retaining wall

- this may be factor in ability to install a pathway around pond(s)
- Residents' Association
  - annual membership invoice to each homeowner in Shawnee
     Park for landscaping and beautification
  - Cardel is currently estimating this will be ~\$250/yr

# SECA Recreation Committee - preliminary ideas

- 2 primary priorities
  - connected pathways preferably not via sidewalks but by green space paths where possible
  - ability to cross the neighbourhood via paths to connect to future commercial developments nearer to the LRT station
- create a community hub
- access points to parks including Fish Creek
  - need to talk with the provincial park office and City of Calgary
  - access behind Lynn's house sees very little use since bridge was flooded out and not replaced - no access to rest of park
  - can the bridge be replaced?
- potential wish list
- adult fitness installations stations along path or grouping value (use)/benefit?
- slide on a hill with climbing handholds instead of stairs build a berm (requires structure underneath) - like Haysboro
- naturalized playground pieces
- dynamic playground pieces
- do we want a stripe down pathways? (lanes)
- permanent washrooms or port potties in the summer?
  - who maintains building on a daily basis?
  - vandalism? cameras?
  - combo lock

**Funding:** other sources of funding can be accessed if we wish and if the plan aligns with program guidelines and eligibility

- Lottery Funds CIP, CFEP
- Parks Foundation
- Red Deer got funding (>\$100K) from AHS to build adult fitness parks
- etc.

## **Next Steps**

- Cardel to provide maps layered version to hi-light pathways
- Cardel's Landscape Architects are starting detailed designs now
- Maureen and Lynn provide a firmer wish list to Cardel by Feb 6
  - will require more research and park visits
  - open to ideas from Board and all residents
  - include photos of desirable playground equipment and amenities
- Maureen Ask Cardel if their required 10% allocation of green space included pathways
- Maureen Ask Cardell and Board are tree rules limiting the potential of amenities? If tree rules were flexible in selected areas what change would they make to the park plan?
- Lynn to update Cathi Groves (City's Neighbourhood Partnership Coordinator)
- Longer Term for Recreation Committee:
  - Recreation Committee may launch an engagement process to inform residents and obtain feedback and preferences.
  - will residents pay a levy to support installation/upkeep of amenities?
  - Preliminary funding survey what's possible, when, who to write etc.
  - more research
  - for discussion
    - installation of benches, etc.
    - garbage pails placement and maintenance
    - doggy bag dispenser?
  - Missing Link Program at the City to connect our neighbourhood pathways to city wide network
