SECA President's Message

In preparing this month's message I had a look back at my December 2016 message. It's hard to believe that a full year has gone by already. The good news is that progress has been made regarding our plea to the City that the cross walks on Shawnee Drive SW need attention. Specifically, our request to have pedestrian activated flashing lights installed at the intersection at Shawnee Drive SW and 6th Street SW has been accepted. In fact, by the time this Newsletter gets distributed the lights may have actually been installed. We are continuing to pursue other crosswalk and road infrastructure concerns with the City for Shawnee Drive SW.

Cardel, Genstar and Graywood have also made good progress in the east of Shawnee Park with completion of the street and utility development for phases 2, 5 and 6 (see http://www.cardelhomes.com/calgary/communities/shawnee-park/community-map for map).

The not so great news is that SECA was unsuccessful in getting a phased approach to the stripping and grading of the remainder of the development property. Cardel Homes, through the management of Genstar Development Company began grading the balance of the Shawnee Park development lands in August and hope to complete their site preparation for next spring (and before winter forces them to shut down for the year). Their reasoning is that in this way the operation is completed as quickly as possible during only one construction season, rather than prolonging it over several years. The noise and dirt created by their grading has resulted in numerous complaints from adjacent homeowners. However their contractors work within the confines of City bylaws. This unfortunately means Sunday work when weather windows allow.

The SECA Board agreed at our November meeting to take a break in December so our **next Board Meeting is Tuesday January 16, 2018.** SECA members are welcome to come to any of our meetings. Your input is valued!

Overall it's been a good year for SECA with the success of our Easter Egg Hunt, Stampede Breakfast and Community Cleanup! My thanks to all of you who volunteered or participated in these events. I look forward to seeing at our 2018 events.

In order to proactively prevent these crimes, we would like to pass on the following tips:

- Make sure all valuables are either locked, out of sight or removed from your vehicle, including the electronic garage door opener.

Cold Weather Safety

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) paramedics respond to a number of cold weather related emergencies every winter. However, taking appropriate measures to dress properly and anticipating sudden weather changes and preparing to be out in the cold may reduce your risk of sustaining a cold weather illness/injury. It's also a good idea to store an emergency kit in your vehicle at all times containing extra clothing, blankets, and other road-side supplies.

FROSTNIP

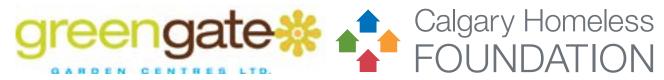
- Frost-nipped skin is extremely cold, but not yet frozen skin;
- It commonly affects the ears, nose, cheeks, fingers and toes;
- The skin may look red and possibly feel numb to the touch;
- When treated promptly, frostnip usually heals without complication;
- Move to a warm environment and immediately, but gently, rewarm the affected area through skin to skin contact (i.e. hand covering tips of ears).

FROSTBITE

- Frostbite occurs when skin becomes so cold that the skin and underlying tissues freeze;
- Affected skin may look white & waxy and will feel hard to the touch;
- Move to a warm environment immediately and place the affected area in warm, not hot, water, until fully re-warmed;
- Call 9-1-1 or seek further medical attention as required.

HYPOTHERMIA

- Hypothermia is abnormally low body temperature, less than 34°C (as compared to normal body temperature of about 37°C);
- Early hypothermia may manifest as profound shivering; moderate hypothermic patients may act inappropriately: stumbling, mumbling, and fumbling, as their body temperature continues to drop resulting in severe hypothermia (<30°C);
- Left untreated, severe hypothermia may progress to unconsciousness or death;
- Early recognition and prompt medical attention is key. Call 9-1-1. Don't forget to protect yourself from the factors that originally lead to the patient's situation;
- Initiate gentle re-warming as quickly as possible. Remove any
 wet or constrictive clothing; cover with blankets, or sleeping
 bags. Protect from further heat loss: eliminate contact with
 cold surfaces, and shield from wind and moisture.

A very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

I want to take this opportunity to wish all residents of Calgary Shaw a wonderful holiday season. Christmas is a reminder to be thankful for our families, friends, and the great communities we live in. I personally am so grateful to serve as your provincial representative in the Legislature. This past year I've had the honour of meeting with hundreds of individuals and community organizations in order to bring their concerns to the government. It has been my pleasure to do so and I look forward to 2018 when we can continue to work together to strengthen our province.

In the Legislature

The Government of Alberta continues to work hard drafting legislation in preparation for the legalization of cannabis. When the federal government introduced legislation to legalize cannabis next summer across the country, it left many decisions about adapting to the federal legislation to provinces and territories. I want to reassure all constituents that I share Alberta's priorities of keeping cannabis out of the hands of youth, protecting safety on roads, in workplaces, and in public spaces, and protecting public health. As a father of 3 small children this is extremely important to me and I want to thank all of you who shared your opinions and expertise on the issue. Public consultation has closed and is now being reviewed in order to introduce legislation early next year. However, if you have any further feedback or questions, contact my office and I will be happy to communicate it to the Ministry of Justice.

As always, my office can provide Notary Public and Commissioner for Oaths services, but it's a good idea to make an appointment well ahead of when you need the document signed. If you need a few provincial pins just connect with my constituency assistants, Michelle and Katharina. They are happy to help you with any issues you may have and can be reached at 403-256-8969.

The Off-Leash Ambassador program is an innovative approach with a volunteer-based, citizen-led initiative to promote responsible pet ownership in Calgary's 150 off-leash parks.

Volunteers in the program will:

- Promote responsible pet ownership, positive pet interactions and safety in off-leash areas through the provision of information and demonstrations
- Answer questions regarding Calgary's bylaws in off-leash areas
- Act as positive role models in off-leash parks in terms of adhering with Calgary's bylaws
- Provide an avenue for citizens to express concerns and pass along concerns to City staff
- Promote the work of Calgary Community Standards and the services available at the Animal Services Centre, such as animal adoption and licensing.

SNIC (SNOW & ICE REMOVAL)

With winter upon us and snowflakes hitting our city streets, it's a good idea to re-familiarize everyone with the City's SNIC program. Roads has a pre-planned, measured response to snowfall that helps make roads safe. The City maintains roads during winter months by:

- Anti-icing before a snow event;
- Sanding, salting and plowing roads; and
- Snow fencing where required.

Roads are cleared based on a Council-approved priority system. The more traffic there is on a road, the higher the priority.

The highest priority roads are classified as Priority Is. The lowest are Priority 4s. Roads is responsible for clearing snow and ice from public roadways and LRT stations. Parks is responsible for the pathway system.

Keeping sidewalks free of ice and snow can be very challenging for seniors and people with limited mobility. Through Snow Angels, you are encouraged to be a good neighbour by clearing snow for those who need assistance.

How to be a Snow Angel: To be a Snow Angel all you have to do is adopt a sidewalk and keep it clear when it snows. Watch for people in your neighbourhood who could use help removing snow and lend them a hand.

Nominate your Snow Angel: You can recognize your Snow Angel by either:

- Calling 311; Filling out a Snow Angel 311 online service request form; or Sending a letter telling us your Snow Angel story.

- \$100.00 will purchase the meal for a family to enjoy over the holidays.

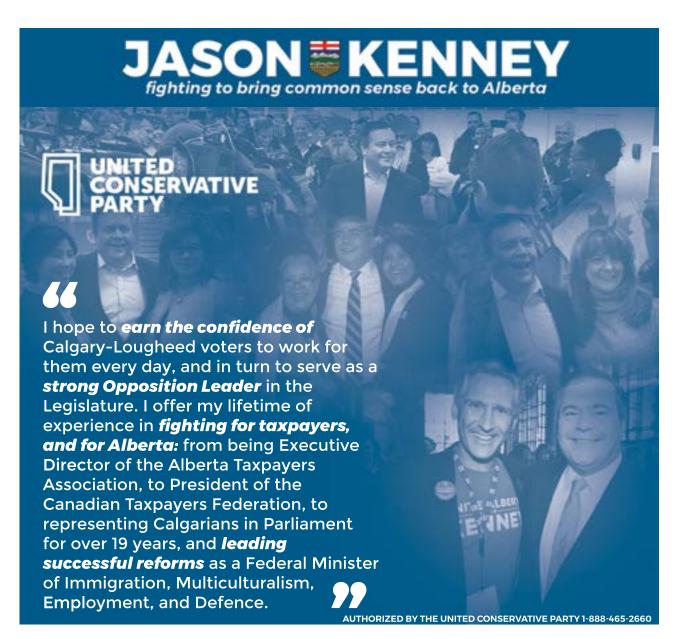
