IMPROVING STORMWATER DRAINAGE FOR SOUTHWEST COMMUNITIES

The Community Drainage Improvements program was launched in 2010 to mitigate flooding in areas throughout the city. Drainage studies were undertaken to identify solutions for communities frequently hit by flooding due to extreme rainfall. Such solutions can include adding additional storm drainage pipes, increasing the size of pipes, and adding wet or dry storm ponds to help manage stormwater.

In recent years the communities of Woodlands, Woodbine, Cedarbrae and Braeside have experienced an unusually high number of high volume rainfall events.

These communities currently have a storm level service of a one-in-five year rainfall event or less. That means that there is a 20 percent chance (or greater) that the storm system will not handle rainfall events causing local flooding in any given year.

Drainage improvements being looked at for these communities target a 1-in-50 year level of service. Once upgrades are in place there will be a two percent chance in any given year that rain events would overwhelm the storm system.

Installation of a dry pond

The City of Calgary will be constructing a new dry pond in the fields located east of the John Ware and St. Benedict schools. This dry pond will greatly reduce flooding during extreme rain events, specifically the flooding that occurs at the intersection of Southland Drive and Braeside Drive. Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2017 with completion by fall of 2018. The fields will remain inaccessible to the public for the entire duration of construction. **Continued top right.**

Construction impacts


- Construction of the dry pond consists of earthworks (excavation and grading), underground piping and landscaping. Construction impacts will include:
- Increased traffic to site (construction crews, trucks hauling materials to and from site) on Southland Drive and on Palliser Drive
- Construction noise
- Fields will remain fenced off and closed to the public for the duration of construction
- Traffic and sidewalk detours

Community benefits

The dry pond will significantly reduce flooding that occurs at Southland Drive and Palliser Drive, and along Braeside Drive. During heavy rainfall, overall vehicle and

pedestrian safety will be improved, traffic congestion reduced and emergency vehicle access unimpeded by flooding. John Ware and St. Benedict schools will each receive a new soccer field (two in total) and a new baseball diamond will be built allowing for more recreational opportunities for the community.





Constituency Update

ow that the fall season is upon us, I am reflecting about the very busy summer we had in Calgary-Shaw. As I am sure you have noticed, there have been a number of construction projects in and surrounding Calgary-Shaw. The intersection at I62nd Ave and McLeod Trail has been completed, the first diverging diamond interchange



in Canada. The interchange provides better traffic flow for east and west traffic on 162nd and Sun Valley Blvd. There is also of course the SW Calgary Ring road. This major project will create hundreds of jobs for Calgarians. It is not just roads and highways our government has invested in. We have also made important investments in upgrading schools, including some here in Calgary Shaw. This work also provides construction jobs as

well as makes schools safer for kids. We inherited a large infrastructure deficit after forming government. Now is a great time to make these investments due to low commodity prices. Leveraging these prices makes economic sense and it will help get many Albertans back to work.

The Legislative Assembly will be resuming at the end of this month and it is my duty to make sure your concerns are addressed in Edmonton. When session resumes my top priority will be creating stable, full-time jobs for Albertans. We are seeing our economy slowly recover-jobs are up, manufacturing is up, exports are up and we are seeing gains across most sectors of the economy where other provinces still see declines. hile most of us do our best to be good neighbours, sometimes we need a little guidance to do the right thing. That's where the Community Standards Bylaw comes in. Updated at the end of 2016, the bylaw promotes good neighbour relationships and addresses community concerns by regulating noise, fire pit use, untidy properties, weeds and grass, graffiti—and nuisances such as flyers.

One of the areas updated in the 2016 review refers to flyers, including non-commercial flyers. If you have a 'no flyer' sign visibly posted at your home, it's a violation of the bylaw to deliver flyers to your door. With the municipal election just around the corner, you should be aware that election advertising is exempt from this bylaw along with newspaper subscriptions, community newsletters and information provided by government and elected officials.

TRICK-OR-TREATING TIPS

Halloween can be a fun and exciting event for kids (and adults). Below are some informative tips to increase neighbourhood safety on October 31.

RESIDENTS:

- Turn on outdoor lights and replace burnt-out bulbs.
- Clear a path from the road to your front door, and remove any potential obstacles or tripping hazards.
- Keep your pets safe. Confine animals indoors away from the unfamiliar (and spooky) guests at the front door.
- Beware of potential food allergies; consider alternative goodies.
- If you're driving be cautious of Goblins, Ghouls and Ghosts out and about in your neighbourhood.

PARENTS:

- Costumes should be short enough to avoid tripping; and be light coloured in order to be easily seen at night. Having your child wear reflective tape will also help them be better seen by drivers.
- Use non-toxic makeup for the costume instead of masks as they can reduce visibility for your child.
- Create an easy to follow route with your children and teenagers.
- Travel in groups of three or four. Young children should be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- Practice crosswalk safety. Make your way up one side of the street and cross to the other side looking both ways, don't criss-cross back and forth.
- Double-check you child's goodie bags to ensure everything is safe to eat.



DEEPER AND DEEPER DEFICIT AND DEBT:

Peter Lougheed sent Alberta in the direction of the best net asset position of any jurisdiction in the free world; and I was there when Ralph Klein raised the pivotal "paid in full" sign, which helped AB to become the best place to live, work, and raise a family. Meanwhile, the NDP's first budget had a \$12 billion deficit; and their second will be about the same. The gov't is continuing on a path of unrestrained spending growth with no plan to ever bring the budget back to balance; and according to their own numbers, in one term, they will put AB's close to \$100 billion in debt!
