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


Board of Director meeting

TRAFFIC

Also make sure you put your winter tires on and turn on your headlights during dawn and dusk so that your taillights are seen.

School Traffic

Please slow down! We all need to be cautious and watch out for each other and each other's kids around the school. Your hurriedness to get to work because you are running late, should not jeopardize the safety of anyone! I have met with each of the three schools in Evergreen, school transportation, city traffic engineers to discuss school traffic safety. There is work in progress. To put it bluntly, the onus is on the drivers in the community and on our parents.

Traffic Speed

Evergreen continues to have a speed problem with the number of cars shortcutting through Evergreen via Fish Creek Blvd. and Everridge Dr. to get to and from 37th St. If you witness ongoing traffic issues during your travels, please take the time to log a traffic service request and email the concerns to me. The link is below. The more frequently we speak up about the traffic issues, the more that can be corrected.



Traffic Safety Forum

Our hold up is finding a suitable location that people will readily attend and won't break the bank. We will keep you posted. The forum will be to discuss traffic issues in Evergreen, what is being done, and we will invite those that can tell us what can be done.

Happy New Year!

By the time you read this update our first ever **Community Campfire** will have happened. Hopefully the weather was fine, and a good-sized group gathered on December 29th at the Evergreen Drive park. Watch for more campfire events at different locations, perhaps even monthly, as part of our work to build a more neighbourly community.

Our **Beautification Committee** has launched. They are starting off by exploring the wrapping garbage bins and utility boxes. If you have additional ideas and are interested in this work, please let us know as with more energy, this committee could accomplish more. Remember to come out to **Neighbour Nights** at the Coach and Horses Ale Room near Sobey's on January 16th from 7 to 9 PM. We are generally there the third Thursday of the month. Watch our e-newsletter and Facebook page for updates as we do skip some months due to holidays, etc.

Our **children's programming** is forging ahead with great success and will grow in 2020 thanks to an energetic volunteer spearheading this work (play@shawneeevergreen. ca). We have received several requests for **adult and senior programs**. SECA is keen to support programming for these groups and with a volunteer or two to assist with coordination, we could make it happen.

SECA's 2020 plans include the Stampede Breakfast, Community Clean-up and Fun Day. The 2nd annual Fun Day is a joint event with surrounding communities. One event that won't happen in 2020 is the Easter Egg Hunt.

Instead, we invite you and your family to connect with neighbours at our Community Campfires to enjoy some hot chocolate, smores and soak-in the magical atmosphere that a campfire creates.

Graywood Developments has made an application to rezone part of their land near the Beacon Hill condos. Originally zoned for townhomes, they are seeking zoning that would permit rental apartments, a senior's home and commercial spaces which could include a gas station and convenience store or strip mall. Parts of their land may be sold off to a third party. At this time (December 10), the SECA Board has not been provided with details related to lot coverage, size and height of buildings, commercial lighting, etc. and without this information it is difficult for us to provide informed feedback to Planning at the City of Calgary. A public engagement session has been promised and SECA will keep residents informed about this rezoning application as it progresses.



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SAFE & SOUND

Toboggan Safety

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and children of a few toboggan/sledding safety tips as the winter season continues. Injuries may result from collisions with stationary objects on the hill, such as trees or rocks, or even collisions with other people. Unprotected falls can also result in more serious injury if you lose control at high speeds. However, everyone can be safe and have fun on the toboggan hill by following these reminders.

Equipment

- Always ensure your toboggan or sledding device is in good repair. Inspect it for any damaged or missing parts before each use;
- Be certain the operator is fully capable of staying in control of the sled at all times;
- Children should wear a certified, properly fitted helmet designed for other high impact sports such as hockey, cycling, or climbing.

Hazards

- Avoid hills that are too steep or too icy;
- Choose hills free of all obstacles such as trees, rocks, utility poles, or fences;
- Beware of loose scarves or clothing containing drawstrings which could present a strangulation hazard if they become caught or snagged.

Plan ahead

- Dress warmly in layers and anticipate weather changes;
- Consider bringing extra sets of gloves and toques to exchange wet garments for dry ones;
- Take breaks, out of the cold, to warm up;
- Cover any exposed skin;
- Even when properly protected from the elements, the finger tips, toes, ears, the tip of the nose, and other high points on the face such as the forehead and cheek bones can be affected by frostbite;
- If frost bite has occurred, treat it by first removing the individual out of the cold environment;

Gently warm the affected skin by placing a warm hand over it, or by placing the affected part in warm, *not hot*, water, until re-warmed.

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
